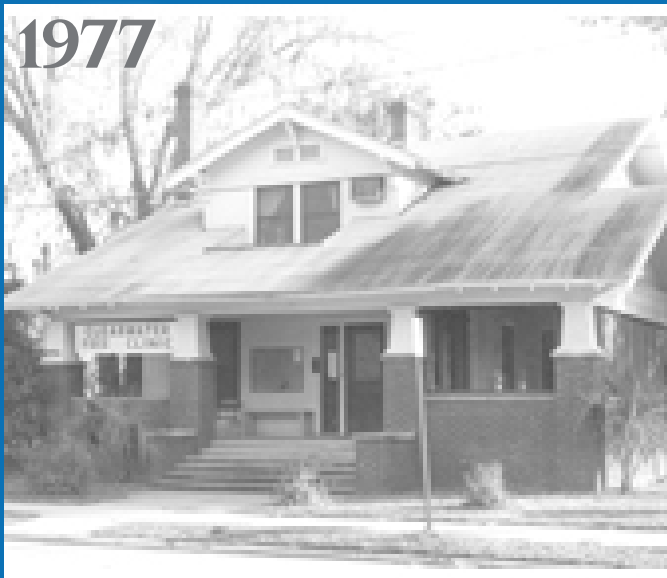

Affordability, accessibility and quality of health care is of paramount concern in our community, especially to our low-income residents. The Clearwater Free Clinic has provided high quality, compassionate, non-emergent healthcare for 40 years. A notion that started in the early 70's has grown and flourished into an organization that provided over \$5.7 million of medical services to the underserved of upper Pinellas County just last year.

None of this growth would be possible without the dedication of our volunteers, staff, community partners, and most importantly YOU...our donors. The CFC does not receive regular governmental funding and relies completely on the generosity of our community and patients.

The Clearwater Free Clinic constantly seeks to fulfill unmet healthcare needs of our patients. 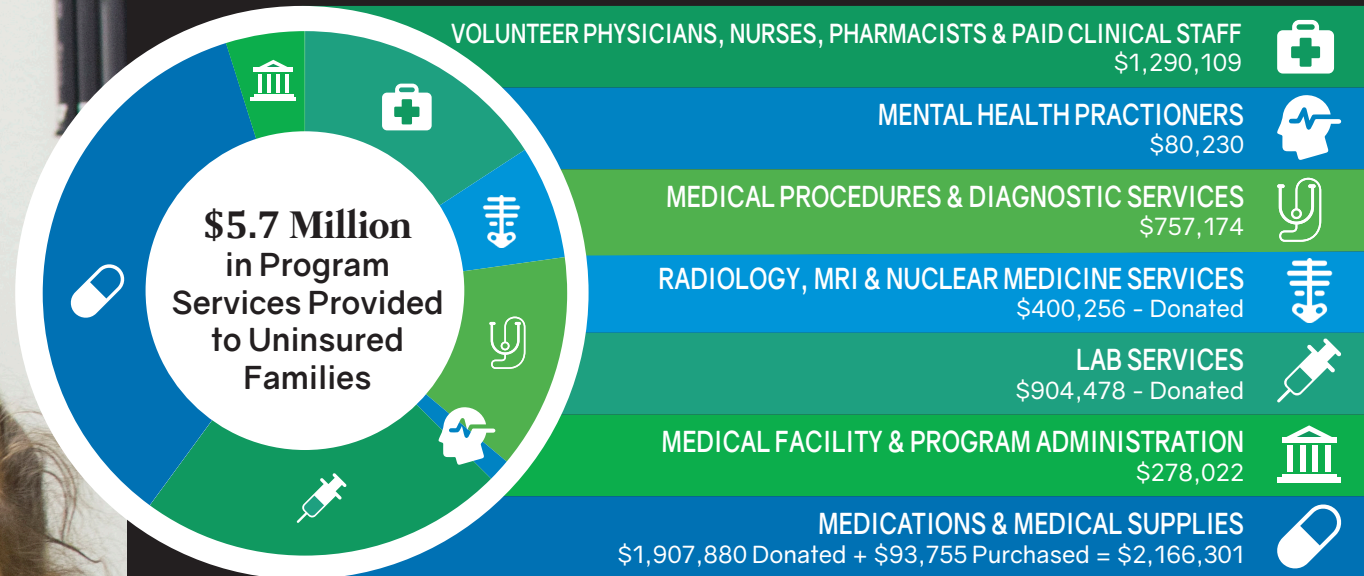

Program Services Provided



Medication Program

In addition to receiving nearly \$2 million in donated medications and medical supplies, the CFC has purchased over \$93,000 in additional medications and medical supplies. Our patients may have as many as 5 or more varying diagnosed conditions, which are often chronic and must be managed with a variety of medications. Through the patient assistance program, our patients are able to get the medications that they need for little or no cost to them. This ease of access to medications relieves patients of the uncertainty of costs associated with managing chronic conditions.

Specialty Medical Care

The CFC boasts a variety of specialty services available to patients, from urology to endocrinology and hematology. It is our dedicated and talented team of volunteer doctors who are at the heart of each of these necessary programs. With a diverse patient population comes a need for adaptable care options with the capability to accommodate the needs of each unique patient. Each of our specialty programs allow for optimal, comprehensive medical and mental health care.

Mental Health

The CFC has received an overwhelmingly positive response from patients who have taken advantage of our mental health services. Typically, these behavioral health visits are supplemental to acute and preventative medical care provided by the Clinic and can dramatically improve the overall health of our uninsured patients. Once operating in our new medical home, the program is expected to expand with more space available for the entire mental health team to work together for the benefit of the patients.

Patient Education

Patient education has become an integral piece of the comprehensive care that the Clinic provides to the uninsured population. The Go Healthy Program equips patients who are living with chronic conditions with the tools and knowledge necessary to manage their symptoms effectively and proactively. This proven, six-week educational course has patients working in a group to promote healing and improve their lives by practicing healthy habits daily.

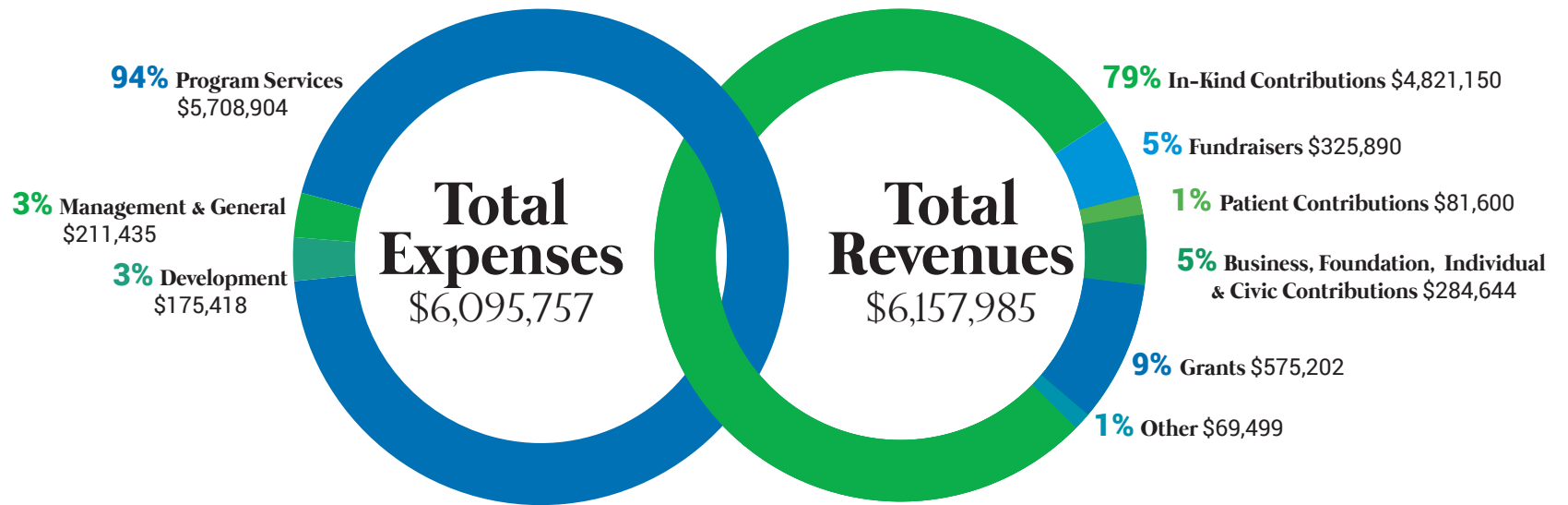
Patients Get the Help They Need to Stay Healthy!

Who We help

The CFC helps low-income, uninsured families access the quality medical and mental health care that they need to live productive, healthy lives. Our patients are self-employed, are currently unable to work, or they work at local establishments that are not able to provide health insurance options to their employees. In any case, the working poor cannot afford private health insurance or the copays and premiums that go along with it. All CFC patients live in Pinellas County and have incomes at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.

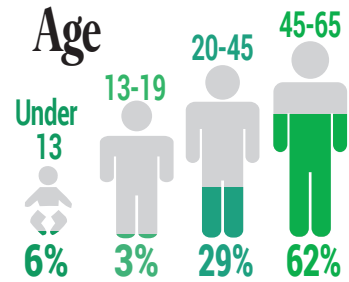
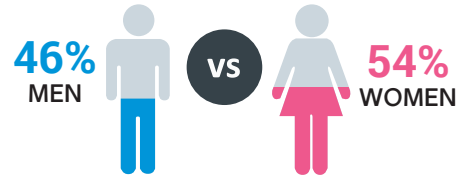

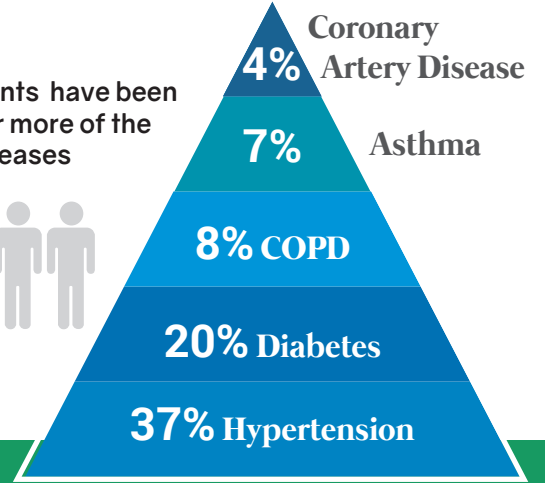

Patient Survey Results

- 77%** of patients would have gone to the Emergency Room for health care if it wasn't for the Clinic.
- 92%** depend on the CFC for monthly medications, most four or more per month.
- 97%** of patients are pleased with the care they receive at the Clinic.
- 83%** of patients said their health has been drastically improved by the care they have received at the CFC.

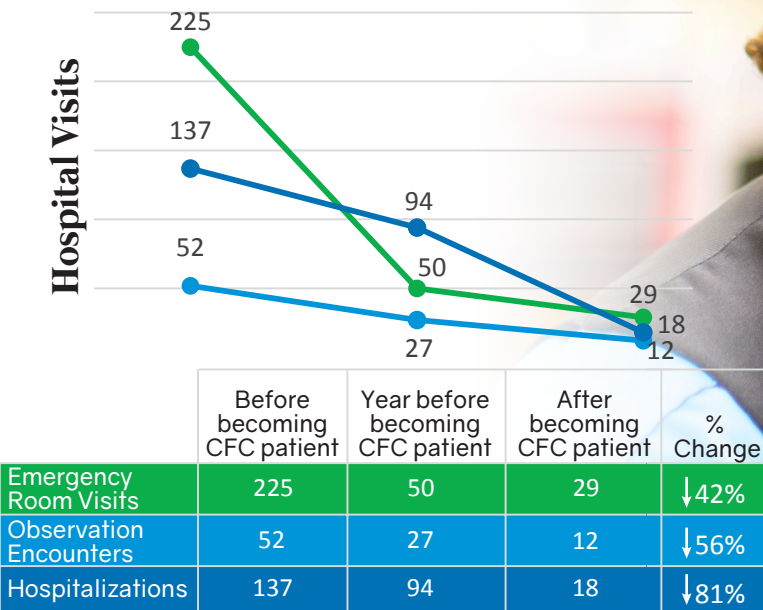


Hospital Referral Program

In 2016 the CFC received funding to initiate an innovative, coordinated care program designed specifically to identify low-income, uninsured hospitalized patients' and upon discharge assist with their transition to the CFC for primary and follow-up care.

This program placed a full-time CFC staff member at Morton Plant Hospital to meet with unassigned patients and determine their Clinic eligibility. The staff member would then facilitate with registration and appointment scheduling to ensure uninterrupted care. By the end of the pilot program in July 2017, 82 patients, who may not otherwise have been able to access follow-up care and medications, were referred and had become patients at the CFC. In addition to these patients finally receiving regular medical care, ER visits and hospital re-admissions have drastically been reduced.

This program demonstrates the value of mutually beneficial partnerships. In this case, the hospital, the Clinic and uninsured patients are all benefactors. Countless dollars and lives are saved when entities work together to provide the best possible care. See the impact below.

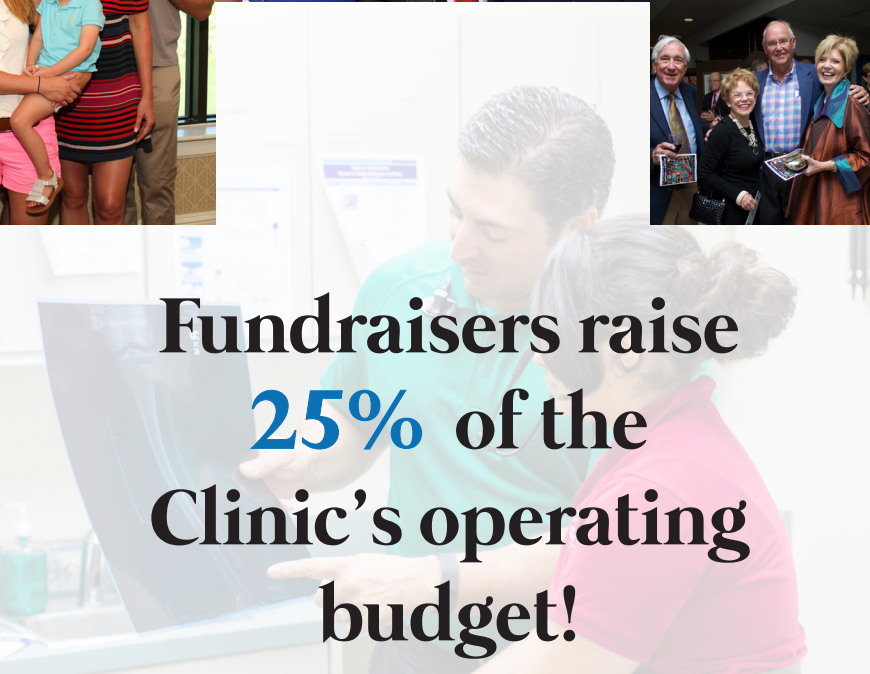

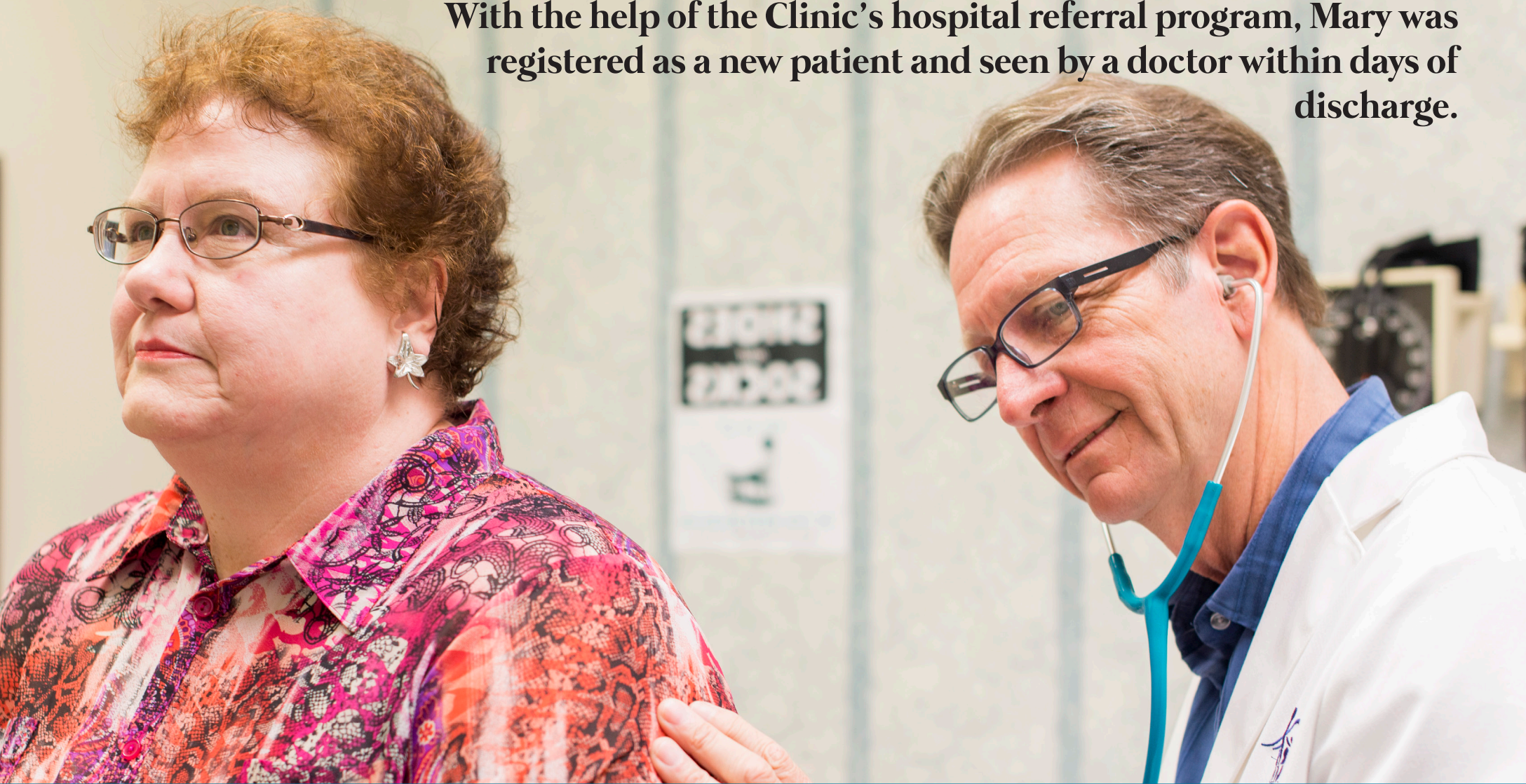


Community Minded... Community Funded

Mary found herself recently without access to private health insurance and in February, spent two weeks in the emergency room with an unexplained acute condition. Mary was then introduced to the Clinic through a hospital referral specialist.

Since becoming a patient at the Clinic, Mary has been cared for by many volunteer physicians, received x-rays from Dunedin Imaging, and is able to obtain monthly medications to help regulate her chronic conditions through the prescription assistance program. She has access to the medications and tools she needs to stay healthy and is on her way to better health and a better life.
