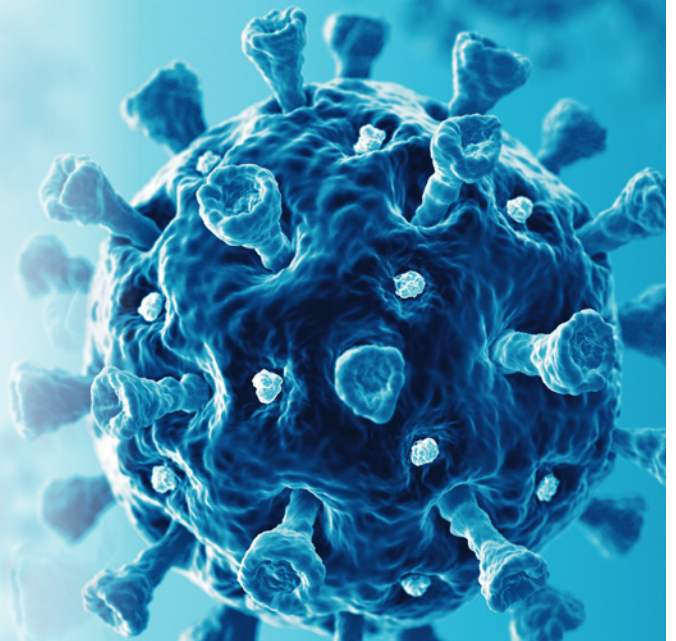

A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

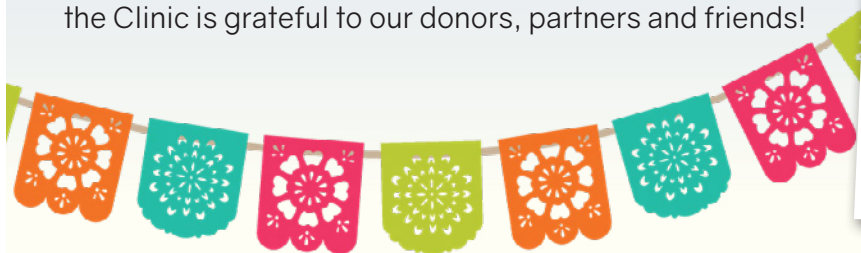

COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OF TAMPA BAY MATCHING FUNDS



The devastating effects of the COVID-19 virus on our community are undeniably heartbreaking. Thankfully, society is making changes that increase connectedness, safety and accessibility through technology. Telemedicine has been widely embraced by health care professionals as an alternative way to provide healthcare services. Because of COVID-19 restrictions, the Clearwater Free Clinic needed a way to continue patient visits at home and telemedicine was the answer.

Thanks to the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay's COVID Relief Funding Needs Matching Program and the Schwerin Family, the Clinic received financial support to implement a telemedicine platform that allows the CFC providers to provide remote healthcare visits to patients when indicated.

In addition, the Clinic received funding to support the Clinic's medication program. In March, the Clinic's Medication Program began dispensing medications in 60-day quantities, creating a significant strain on the program's resources. This step was necessary in order to reduce the need for patients to leave their homes to frequent the Clinic's facility and risk exposure to the COVID-19 virus.

The health and safety of volunteers, staff and patients throughout the COVID-19 pandemic has been one of the CFC's prime concerns.
