
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

CARING FOR THE WHOLE PATIENT

At the Clearwater Free Clinic, comprehensive care is an approach to manage multiple physical and emotional health problems simultaneously. Our organization uses a wide range of Clinic services along with the expertise of numerous medical professionals to provide integrated healthcare...treating the whole patient. The Clinic's extensive volunteer workforce provides specialty services to prevent, monitor, and treat a wide range of conditions while community partners are able to provide more advanced procedures and testing not available at the CFC. The Clinic's Behavioral Health program completes our integrated









Clinic patients also have the opportunity to achieve a healthier lifestyle by participating in educational initiatives. Currently, the CFC offers a smoking cessation class and two wellness programs: "My Heart, My Health" and the Go Healthy Chronic Disease Self-Management Program to enhance their health.

Comprehensive care ultimately allows providers to monitor the health of a patient as a whole, helping to identify diseases earlier, making treatments easier, resulting in fewer emergency hospital visits and better outcomes!

CARE CHRONICALS: Meet Bobi



As a new CFC patient, Bobi received treatment for hypothyroidism and hypertension. It didn't take long for her primary care provider and ARNP, Corey, to discover that she also was diabetic. Through the Clinic's on-site medication program, she received the medications and support she needed to manage these conditions. Bobi says about her current situation,

"I would love to be able to afford health insurance. Right now, my life is at a spot where I can at least pay my bills, put gas in my car and put the right food on the table. Any extra that I have, I donate to the Clearwater Free Clinic."

Fatigue initially presumed to be related to her hypothyroidism diagnosis was found to be a symptom of severe depression and she was directed to the Clinic's Behavioral Health team to address these issues. With new clarity and the guidance of the Clinic's Healthy Living Coach, Georgeann, she was motivated to make big changes! The integrated care she received at the Clinic inspired Bobi to commit to a healthy diet and lifestyle, and she has seen improvements in all areas of her life. We are proud of how far Bobi has come and the CFC will continue to help her meet her goals.

Leslie is one of the fabulous volunteer clerks who help keep the front desk at the CFC running like clockwork!


