
THE SEASON OF GIVING IS HERE!

What is a CGM?

A Continuous Glucose Monitor (CGM) is a tool often used for diabetic patients. With the device, glucose levels can be monitored 24 hours a day and a patient can be alerted when glucose levels fall too low or rise too high.



The CFC is proud to announce this year's Physician of the Year is Dr. Belur Sreenath!


To honor his service, the Top of the Bay Kiwanis Club donated \$1000 to the Clinic.


SYLVIA HARDAWAY


