

The Kiwanis Club of Greater Clearwater kicked-off the Free Clinic Fund Drive to raise \$262,000 for a new location on 707 include four exam rooms, a lab, pharmacy, patient conference room, and lounge fo

The Clinic was viewed as a sort of medical safety valve for our financially strapped citizens. It was an independent organization never seeking or accepting funds from any government source. Funding was based on donations from the citizens, merchants, social organizations and religious groups in the area.



The clinic provides basic health care for persons working at minimum wage; those living on a small fixed income; and those who have no other recourse for diagnosis and treatment.

The Clearwater Chamber named the Clearwater Free Clinic the Small Non-Profit of the Year.








