NEW UKULELE CLASS AT THE CFC OFFERS A NEW LOOK AT THERAPY

In October, the Clearwater Free Clinic (CFC) introduced a new program for Behavioral Health patients centered around the use of music as a form of therapy. The ukulele class introduced a new instrument to many of the patients at the CFC and allowed them to express their feelings and emotions musically. Over a 6-week period, patients learned the basic skills of the ukulele and practiced familiar tunes and songs.



The ukulele class was generously funded by a gift from the Tampa Bay Ukulele Society who donated ukuleles for CFC patients and led by volunteers from the Dunedin Ukes Club. The first classes took place every Tuesday for an hour and a half to explore new notes, chords, and techniques.

With the completion of the ukulele class, patients would receive the ukuleles as gifts. Many patients said it has provided them with many benefits, including a sense of accomplishment, joy, and an outlet for their emotions.

Diving into Diabetes & Health

THE CFC STARTS THE DEEP CLASS FOR DIABETIC PATIENTS

In late October, the Clearwater Free Clinic (CFC) began the first Diabetes Education & Empowerment Program (DEEP) for diabetic and pre-diabetic patients. Funded by Baycare and led by the Clinic's Healthy Living Coach, Georgeann O'Leary, the class served as an education and support group. A group of 10 CFC patients gather every Monday for two hours to learn more about diabetes management, healthy eating habits, exercise techniques, and share their own experiences with others.

Patient Impact: Bonnie

Worried she would not be able to afford her diabetes medicine, Bonnie learned about the CFC from a friend who was a patient at the time. Without insurance, Bonnie was in need of a medical home. Diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes over 20 years ago, she struggled to regulate her glucose, manage her symptoms, and maintain a healthy lifestyle. Bonnie regularly attends the DEEP classes taught by Georgeann and learned more about diabetes management and healthy living.

"The class has been really helpful in teaching us about how diabetes affects the whole human body," Bonnie said. "I've been on a healthier diet and more self-disciplined."

Since becoming a patient, Bonnie has lowered her A1C to 6.0 percent - the lowest it has been in 20 years.

THE CFC RAISES FUNDS FOR NEW CGM MONITORS



In recognition of #GivingTuesday - an annual day of giving on November 29th for nonprofits and communities worldwide - the CFC asked the community to support the purchase continuous glucose monitors (CGMs) for our diabetic patients. These life-changing devices are far too expensive for our patients without insurance or ample income to afford. CGM devices are instrumental in diabetes management by providing patients with 24/7 monitoring of glucose levels. These devices also reduce the number of fingerstick tests patients must do daily. On November 17, 2022, the Clearwater Free Clinic (CFC) dedicated its beautiful ophthalmology suite in honor of physician volunteer Dr. Louis Michaelos. Dr. Michaelos is credited for starting the Clinic's eye program in 2002. With direction and support from Dr. Michaelos, a storage closet was equipped and transformed into the Clinic's first dedicated eye room. Over the past 20 years, thousands of Clearwater Free Clinic patients have received specialized eye care because of Dr. Louis Michaelos' commitment to the uninsured population of our community. In their 2022 fiscal year, the Clearwater Free Clinic had 152 eye appointments to support patients who would otherwise not be able to get the care they needed.

CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF SANDY MILLED

It is with great sadness and love that we remember the incredible life of Sandra "Sandy" Miller: a true friend, volunteer, and board member of the Clearwater Free Clinic. Her generous heart touched the lives of countless individuals throughout her life as she was deeply committed to her community and beyond. As a cardiac care specialist, Sandy participated in clinical trials and established guidelines for state of the art nursing care. Sandy volunteered at the Clinic as an intake nurse starting in 2000 and served on the Board for seven years.

CARE CHRONICLES: SUSAN

In 2016, Susan happened to drive by the Clinic and was interested to find out more. After learning about the Clinic's mission and goal, she immediately became a patient and has made the CFC her healthcare home.

After she expressed mental health issues, Susan was quickly enrolled in our Behavioral Health program. Susan suffered from routine mental breaks caused by intrusive thoughts, feelings of tension, high blood pressure, and restlessness. Our Behavioral Health specialists were able to help Susan find ways to cope with her emotions and manage her anxiety.

In 2019, Susan again faced challenges managing her anxiety after COVID-19 isolated her from friends and family. She also struggled with maintaining clients and contracts for her cleaning business. Not to be deterred, Susan continued to visit CFC's Behavioral Health program to manage her mental health. Realizing she needed more extensive care, the CFC was able to refer Susan to another local mental health program where she could get more in-depth care and medication at no cost to her.



"The people [at CFC] are fantastic. I would rather come here than go to a private doctor," Susan said. "I have referred other people to come here. They are some of the best people I've known."

In addition to receiving mental health care, Susan has attended three classes recommended by our Behavioral Health specialist. Her favorite has been the Go Healthy class.

Susan is now receiving the care she needs and does not hesitate to give the Clinic praise.



MEET SADIE

THE CFC WELCOMES SADIE AS THE NEW THERAPY DOG

The CFC is thrilled to introduce Sadie, a nineyear-old Yorkshire Terrier, as our new Behavioral Health therapy dog. In February, Sadie's owner, LuAnn, brought her to the Clinic because she needed to be monitored after a major surgery. Sadie instantly fell in love with the Clinic staff, volunteers, and patients. Never having been

trained as a therapy dog, Sadie surprised many of the CFC staff with how nurturing and calming she was for patients in the Behavioral Health Program. Sadie now comes once a week as a volunteer therapy dog and works with the behavioral health specialists to provide support and comfort.
